HEADTEACHER NEWS

Dear Parents and Carers,

Today it is all about Oak class!

I want to start by saying a big thank you to the parents and carers of children in Oak class as they have won the attendance award three weeks in a row now. We know that it can sometimes be a challenge to get your child to school every day and on time and we are grateful for the huge effort put into this. There is always great excitement during our Friday assembly when the winning class is announced. Greater excitement when the class have their ten minutes extra play-time with a biscuit.

Oak class also have the greatest number of children arriving to school for when the doors open at 8.30 a.m. – Learning starts immediately and those children who arrive at this time benefit from 75 minutes extra work each week. Feedback from teachers across the school is that children who get their early work done are at an advantage as they are able to practise and consolidate key skills and concepts. If you and your child rush through the gate at 8.45 a.m. perhaps next week could be a good chance to get in that little bit earlier.

EYFS - Ash

Ash class have been really enjoying our Superhero topic. In Literacy we have started a new book Superworm by Julia Donaldson. They have searched for worms (pasta) in the soil and written descriptions of Superworm using our knowledge of special friends. In maths we have been making teen numbers using numicon, ten frames and practising writing the numbers too. We are also learning to count beyond 20, recognising number patterns. We are now moving onto looking at adding within 10. We have also been learning about people that help us in everyday life and are our real superheroes. In expressive arts we have made Supertato and a worm linked to the stories we have read. The children are really embracing the topic and enjoying their learning.



YEAR 1 - Maple

We have been enjoying our Hero Hunters topic so far this half term! We had lots of fun on our Immersion day, dressing up as superheroes and creating our own superhero badges!

We have been learning about our senses in Science, and have enjoyed our different experiments – in particular our taste testing!



YEAR 2 - Oak

We have set off on an Adventure around the world with The Three Bears, who need a break after Goldilocks upset their home! We have been busy tasting different bread from all the different continents and took a class vote to decide which bread we will recreate. Australian Fairy bread was the winner! We then explored how bread is made and have begun to design our own shapes (using plasticine to practise our shaping skills) for our fairy bread to make the product more appealing to the consumer.

Closer to home in Geography we have been learning all about maps and atlases and have made a sketch map of Heelands local area and a 3D model map. Over the next few weeks our adventures with the bears will continue as we write baby bear a bedtime story and make clothes for their holiday!
