In Maples Class we have been very busy with the Nativity rehearsals!


We have finished our hot write for our story The Queen's Handbag and tried really hard to use our full stops, finger spaces and capital letters.

Great work, Maple Class.






YEAR 2 - Oak

In Maths we have been exploring our addition and subtraction skills, using lots of practical apparatus to help us.



YEAR 2


The new topic is 'Location, Location.'
