HEADTEACHER NEWS

Dear Parents and Carers,

At Heelands, we are committed to ensuring that all children have equal access to learning opportunities, experiences and support, regardless of family circumstances.

Your child may be eligible for Pupil Premium, which provides the school with additional funding to help support children and families in a variety of ways.

Who is eligible for Pupil Premium?

Your child may be eligible if you receive any of the below benefits:

- Universal Credit (with a household income within the qualifying threshold)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (with an annual income below the qualifying threshold and not receiving Working Tax Credit)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after stopping work)

Your child may also be eligible if:

- They are looked after by the local authority
- They were previously looked after and left care through adoption, a special guardianship order or a child arrangements order
- They have a parent serving in the armed forces

Even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 and receives universal free school meals, it is still important to register, as this allows the school to receive Pupil Premium funding.

How Pupil Premium can help at Heelands

Through Pupil Premium funding, we are able to offer additional support, including:

- Trips and visits at a 50% reduction, or in some cases free of charge
- Support with the purchase of school clothing and shoes
- Referrals to local support schemes, such as local bike initiatives, where children may be provided with a reconditioned bicycle
- Additional learning and wellbeing support within school

All information is treated confidentially, and accessing this support helps us to continue providing the best possible opportunities for our children.

We have been busy learning a new story called 'Rosie's Walk', the children have been acting out the story, building windmills and beehives linked to the story and writing about the farm they have designed. They have also labelled a hen in their writing books.

We have now moved onto capacity where we have been exploring mass and discussing which objects will be heavier or lighter. The children have been pretending to be balancing scales and predicting which object is the heaviest.

Last but not least the children have had some 'egg'citing visitors. Our eggs arrived on Monday and are in an incubator, so far 5 have hatched! They will be with us for another week and we will be doing lots of learning around the chicks.

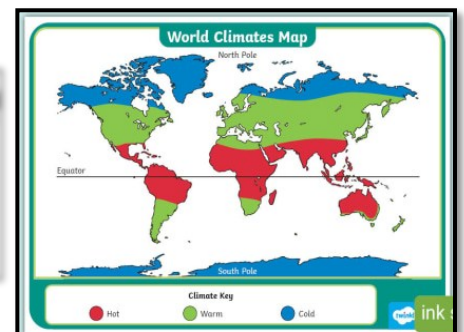


YEAR 1 - Maple

The children have loved learning about China.



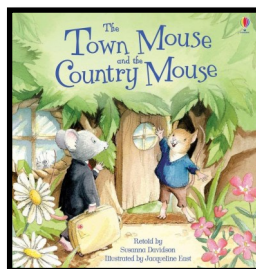
YEAR 2 - Oak

MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS AND MEDICINE:

APPOINTMENTS:

Please can we remind parents/carers that GP Doctors and Dentist appointments ideally need to be taken outside of the school day or during school holidays. That means please make appointments **BEFORE 08:30** or **AFTER 3:10**.

It is extremely disruptive when children have to be taken to appointments during the school day. Not only does your child miss essential learning, but it also interrupts the class when children see another pupil leaving.

(We of course understand that hospital appointments have to be taken when they are given.)

Please be mindful when making appointments, thank you for your co-operation.

MEDICINES:

It is school policy that we will only give Calpol if it has been prescribed by a Doctor. If it is over the counter then we ask parents to come in.

We do administer antibiotics. Parents are required to complete a yellow medicines form with the details which needs to be signed.
