Dear Parents and Carers,

As we begin to see the first signs of spring and enjoy brighter mornings and lighter afternoons, we would like to take this opportunity to focus on something that makes a real difference to every child in our school – attendance.

As a small school, every child truly counts. Each pupil plays a vital role in our school community, and when a child is absent, it is noticeable — not just in the classroom, but in friendships, group activities and the wider life of the school.

Recently, we have found ourselves in the lower percentage of similar schools nationally for attendance. We understand that the winter months have brought their fair share of coughs, colds and seasonal illnesses, which cannot always be avoided. However, even a few days of absence each half term can quickly add up and create gaps in learning.

Fun Fridays

To help boost attendance and celebrate being in school every day, we are introducing “Fun Fridays” for the next half term.

Every child is invited to come to school in their own clothes every Friday. We hope this will provide a fun incentive and something for the children to look forward to each week.

We hope Ash Class have a lovely half term and look forward to becoming gardeners in Spring 2.

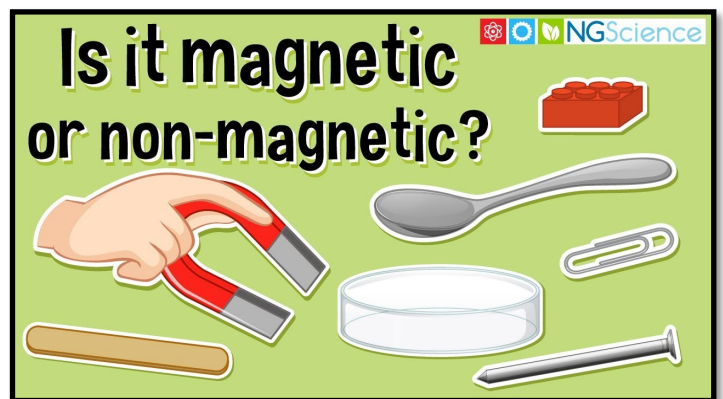


YEAR 1 - Maple

World Book Day...

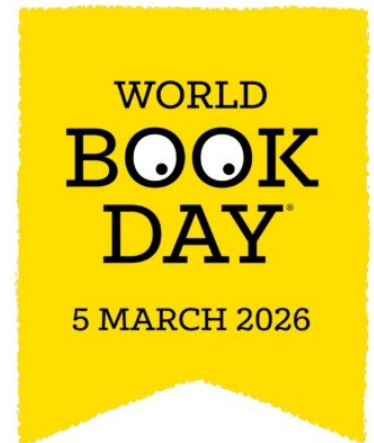
THURSDAY 5TH MARCH IS WORLD BOOK DAY.

If you can answer **YES** to any of the below,
you may be eligible for
Free School Meals / Pupil Premium

The School Office will help with your application.

If your application is successful, not only will your child receive free school meals, but our school will receive £1,515 additional funding (per child). This is called Pupil Premium.



ALL APPLICATIONS ARE CONFIDENTIAL

Free school meals are available to pupils in receipt of, or whose parents are in receipt of, one or more of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on – paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
