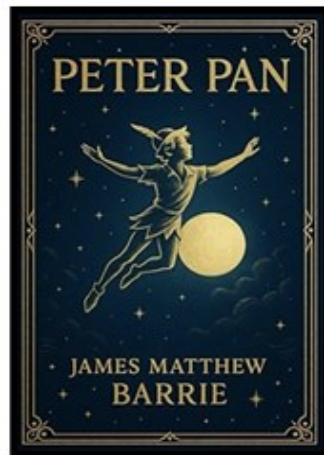

We have started to learn our new story Peter Pan and are very excited to write our hot write this week! Maples have been working incredibly hard with their writing and I am very proud of them.

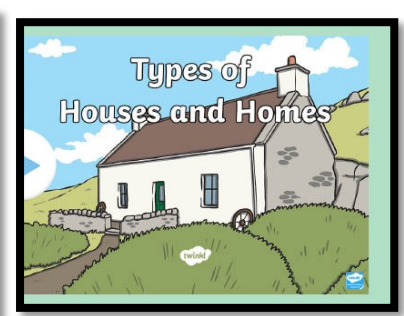
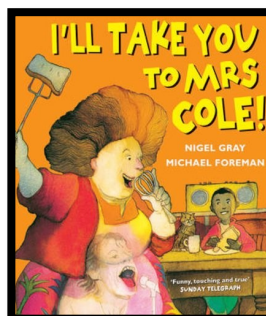


YEAR 2 - Oak

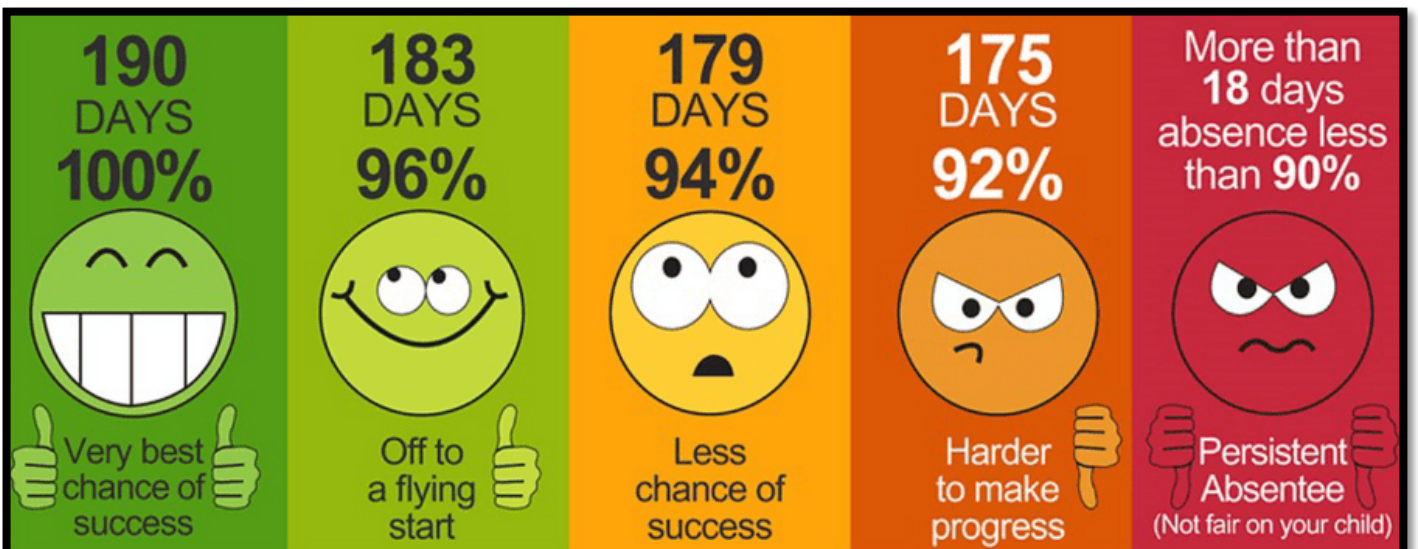
