



YEAR 1 - Lions

School attendance and impact of the pandemic

- Poor school attendance has serious implications for children and young people:
 - ➤ Lower attendance is correlated with lower attainment outcomes for pupils at both Key Stage 2 and Key Stage 4.
 - Regular school attendance is also associated with a wider set of social, health and civic benefits, and school-based interventions are shown to have a significant positive impact on pupils who are struggling; as such, school attendance underpins holistic wellbeing for young people.
- □ National and local attendance data shows there has been a dramatic change in school attendance levels since the pandemic, counteracting all the positive work that had previously taken place.
