# EYFS - Monkeys

We have had an exciting two weeks! Last Monday some eggs were delivered in an Incubator and we had the opportunity to watch these eggs wobble, crack (pip) and chirp until finally they hatched! The children loved coming into school each day to see if more chicks had hatched and some even talked about watching the live stream we had set up. We have had the opportunity to look after 8 chicks. Monkeys class have learnt that the female chicks are light brown and the males are lemon yellow. They will be going home on Friday, but we have loved looking after them and looking at lifecycles. In literacy we have been reading 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar', learning the story and writing simple sentences based on the book. In Maths we have been focusing on the numbers 9 and 10 and their composition. The children are trying really hard to learn their number bonds to 5 and now to 10, please keep practising this at home. The next few weeks we will be looking at life cycles of plants and learning about how to grow our own sunflowers!





### YEAR 1 - Lions

We have been learning about the Great Fire of London in Lions class. The children have been fantastic historians asking questions about the past. On our Immersion Day they enjoyed making bread like Thomas Farriner did in his Bakery on Pudding Lane — it was yummy! We were very proud of ourselves because the bread turned out really well for our first go! We also used different pastels to create fire artwork, which turned out really well.





# YEAR 2 - Giraffes

We have set sail on our voyage of discovery about the Titanic. We had a great day dressing up and exploring how it felt to be a passenger. We have been learning the order of the dramatic events creating timelines and memorising our facts. 
